HISTORY

The Bicycle Stamp Club was formed in 1980 as the Bicycles On Stamps Study Unit of the American Topical Association. The first issue of Spoke 'n Word, the Club's Newsletter, was dated August 1980.

By early 1985, nine issues had been published. After a change of Editor, the tenth issue was published that focused mainly on Cinderella material. In the Summer of 1986, the first of what was to become semi-annual issues of "Bicycle Stamps" appeared.

In 1990, with a new editor in Australia the magazine became a quarterly publication. A gap in publication occurred following the sudden death in June 2011 of Tony Tiedeman, until Brian Sole as Acting Editor resumed issuing "Bicycle Stamps" twice a year in March and September.

A regular feature of the magazine is "New Issues" prepared by Thomas Matthies in Germany. The magazine is prepared in A4 format with black and white printing, despatched by post from England. Members are encouraged to accept copies by email with the advantage of seeing illustrations in colour.

The Club is affiliated to the British Thematic Association.

"BICYCLE STAMPS" MAGAZINE

Undoubtedly, the main reason for being a member is the quarterly magazine "Bicycle Stamps". Currently the magazine appears in March and September.

In each issue the Editorial is followed by details of New Issues. Various articles by members and outside contributors appear and copies of pages from Members' collections are often included. There are reports from the Treasurer and the USA Treasurer.
